Roberta also reported that <u>sewing machine cleanings will no longer be available on the fourth Thursday of the month to members.</u> Julie Thurman had issues at the February cleanings and has decided that if you would like to have your machine cleaned, you will need to bring it to her house. Do not expect a same day turn around.

Throughout the program, our residents experience the transforming power of love and are equipped with tools to overcome negative influences and past trauma as they rebuild relationships with their parents.

## NNQS Committee Meeting March 28, 2024

Attendees: Karen Allen, Trudy Coogan, Pam Peugh, Roberta Waterfield, Vicki Stanley, Alycia Woodman, Brenda Pfannenstiel, Sandy Cerra, Debbie Gamm, Jean Newton, Karen Baker, Marci Hainkel, and Vicki Nagayama.

Karen Allen called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm. The minutes were approved with one correction, that Roberta Waterfield will collect the Special Exhibits entries at the September guild meetings where the rest of the quilts for the show will be turned in rather than at the August meeting.

The Quilt Show Budget was approved by the Day Guild's board and Debbie Gamm will bring it to the Nitetime board in April.

Karen announced that we have open positions to fill: Publicity, Quilt Turn-In, and Quilt Release. We also need an additional person to help with Admissions, and another person for Door Prizes.

We have appealed for help locating the chain gang quilt for two years with no response, so we will deem it lost and hope that someday it turns up again.

The Committee again discussed the need to change the Northland Needlers Quilt Show date to alternate years with the Kansas City Regional Quilt Festival, along with some of the effects of this change on bylaws, expenses, and scheduling the venue.

Committee Reports were brief, as some people were unable to attend and some committees do not have much to report yet.

**Door Prizes**—Trudy Coogan said she would accept Door Prizes at any time, but the Committee agreed that we do not need too many prizes as it becomes difficult to get them all distributed during the show. Coupons for a free guild membership would be offered to guild members again this year.

Ribbons--Jean Newton has most of the ribbons needed for the show already.

**Silent Auction**—The day guild will vote at their April meeting on the charity to receive the proceeds from the Silent Auction, as it is their turn to choose.

**Special Exhibit**—25 people have signed up so far; we had 38 last year and could in theory accept as many as 80 quilts this year in the space allotted.

**Vendors**—Marci Hainkel reported that Linda Everhart will not be able to attend our show this year but her fee will be held over for the next show. A vendor that sells mugs offered to have mugs with the show logo if copyright permitted. The Committee voted to grant permission for this purpose.

The Show Committee discussed how to get more people involved in chairing committees for the quilt show. We cannot continue to have shows if enough members (a high enough percentage of members) do not do the work. It was suggested that we educate guild members about the duties and time commitments expected of each position so members will be less intimidated about volunteering. Cindy Rubenking has agreed to be the assistant co-chair from the Nitetime Needlers, so we only have a few positions left to fill but we also have opportunities to assist on several committees. The Bazaar will welcome workers on Wednesdays to sort, package and price donations; look for announcements about these work days in the guild newsletters.

Roberta Waterfield will be unable to attend next month's Show Committee meeting so she will make arrangements for someone else to have the key to the church basement that evening.

## Set aside time to sew By Barbara Gas Detroit Free Press

We can be grateful for many advances in our sewing world. We're glad to have new products to make the process more efficient, new books for reference and enjoyment, new classes to expand our horizons, new exhibits to inspire, and new friends to share our enthusiasm for all forms of needlework.

Perhaps, though, you're feeling frustrated because you have more ideas than actual time for executing them, A few suggestions:

- Be realistic about what you can do. Choose a project that will give you pleasure, and work at it steadily.
- Make sure your work space is efficient and your equipment is up to date.
- Take advantage of small blocks of time and you'll be surprised at how much can be done. Rhonda Watson's 10 commandments were first printed in *Sew News* magazine:
  - 1. Thou shalt put away no ironing board before its time.
  - 2. Thou shalt not expect meals, clean laundry or a sparkling house when sewing calls.
  - 3. Thou shalt walk through this room as if threading on needles and pins.
  - 4. Thou shalt not use my fabric shears.
  - 5. Thou shalt not covet my sewing machine.
  - 6. Thou shalt stick no unthreaded needles in the pincushion.
  - 7. Thou shalt always remember a stitch in time saves nine.
  - 8. Thou shat not touch my organized mess.
  - 9. Thou shalt remember that each item sewn is stitched with love and care.
  - 10. Thou shalt praise God often for all creative talents.
