" Brandi's Bag Class "

Supplies are as follows:

Exterior Fabric - Cut Two 11.5 X 7"

Lining Fabric: - Cut Two 11.5 x 7" & Four 1 x 1.5 "

Binding - Cut Three 2 x 11.5" & Two 2 x 4"

Interfacing- Fusible Medium weight Cut TWO 11.5 X 7"

Other supplies: Zipper foot, Matching Thread, Clips or Pins, TWO ZIPPERS 12" or longer

Sewing Machine & all sewing notions

Please have these few steps completed

iron interfacing to wrong side of the lining fabric { Both pieces }

On one of the 11.5 ends of each line [piece, fold & iron a 1/4" fold wrong side to wrong side (this will create a nice seam to the inside of your bag)

On all 5 pieces of binding trifold & iron (fold in half, press, unfold & fold each side to the center line, press. Fold the center line again & press. all raw edges should be inside the fold, starch will make it stiffer.

With The four 1x 1.5" pieces of lining folded in half & press, you should have a 1 x 0.75" square, starch if desired.

Karen Allen called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Present were: Brenda Pfannenstiel, Karen Allen, Alycia Woodman, Jean Newton, Judy LaVeer, Gwen Weakley, Mary Ann Robker, Trudy Coogan, Roberta Waterfield, Pam Peugh, Joann Thomas, Debbie Gamm, Vicki Nagayama, Marci Hainkel, Trish Rogers, and Sandra S. Cerra.

There was no Treasurer's Report, but Vicki Nagayama did ask for a list of legal names for the people who will be signatories on the Show bank account. Karen offered to call them to schedule a bank visit to sign the papers.

Debbie Gamm moved, and Joann Thomas seconded the motion to accept the previous month's meeting minutes. There were no objections from the Committee members.

Old Business:

Debbie Gamm announced that both guilds had voted their agreement to change from an annual show to a biannual show on alternating years with the Kansas City Regional Quilt Festival.

Karen Allen said she lacked the appropriate software to update the Viewer's Choice Ballots to add Best of Show, so Gwen Weakley volunteered to edit the ballots. After a brief discussion it was agreed that Best of Show would not have a color designation on the ballot.

Committee Reports:

Bazaar: Judy LaVeer and Jean Newton reported that they had been collecting items, and that they had been given 25 small quilts from the Nitetime Needlers. They offered the quilts to the Silent Auction. Debbie Gamm reported that the missing chain gang quilt made by Sandy Cliff had been found in the Nitetime Needlers storage closet.

Door Prizes: Trudy Coogan reported that she has several door prizes and expects to receive more. Free guild memberships were briefly discussed as door prizes.

Publicity: Sandy Cerra reported that she hadn't done anything yet but was preparing the work.

Quilt Registration: Vicki Nagayama said she would put a notice in each guild's newsletter to tell how and when to register guilt entries for the show.

Quilt Turn-In/Release: Karen Allen said she had retrieved the pillowcases so she could launder them in time for quilt turn-in at the September guild meetings.

Ribbons: Jean Newton will finish the ribbons before the show.

Signs: Show Committee Members were reminded to prepare a list of any signs needed for the show so Phyllis Carlysle can prepare the signs.

Silent Auction: Pam Peugh reported that quilts were trickling in and that she would accept more quilts up to the day of the show.

Special Exhibit: Roberta Waterfield has 30 participants signed up.

New Business:

A committee was formed to discuss the language of needed bylaws changes, which will be presented to the Show Committee members before publishing in the guilds' newsletters and calling for a vote of the respective guild memberships. Guild members may offer their comments on bylaws changes to their respective cochairs by email, but the Show Committee will determine what changes should be made based upon the bylaws committee's recommendations. The timeline for completing the guilds' votes should be at the October or November guild meetings, after our September show, to minimize confusion.

Karen Allen raised the question of whether our future shows be scheduled for another month (other than September). Jean Newton recommended that we schedule our show for September 2026 to reserve the church, and decide on or before 2026 if we want to change the timing of the show for 2028. The Committee membership found this an acceptable plan.

When does a WIP become a UFO

After a **FART** (Fabric Acquisition Road Trip) and some **SEX** (Stash Enhancing Experience) it becomes a **PIGS** (Project In a Grocery Sack)

The **PIGS** becomes a **HSY** (pronounced hissy – meaning Haven't Started Yet)

Once you have a **HSY** fit and begin work, it becomes a **WIP** (Work In Progress)

The **WIP** becomes a **UFO** (Unfinished Object) as soon as some other project grabs and holds your attention more than the project that was the **WIP**.
